Oxford's Victorian and Edwardian houses were built with low brick boundary walls and iron railings, many of which were removed in the Second World War.



To help property owners **Oxford Preservation Trust** has also launched its own project to commission and acquire railings patterns which can be used in the casting of new railings.

Patterns are loaned for a small fee. We have patterns available for Park Town, Southmoor/Kingston Road and Norham Manor areas. We will acquire more for use across the city. For more information go to **www.oxfordpreservation.org.uk**.

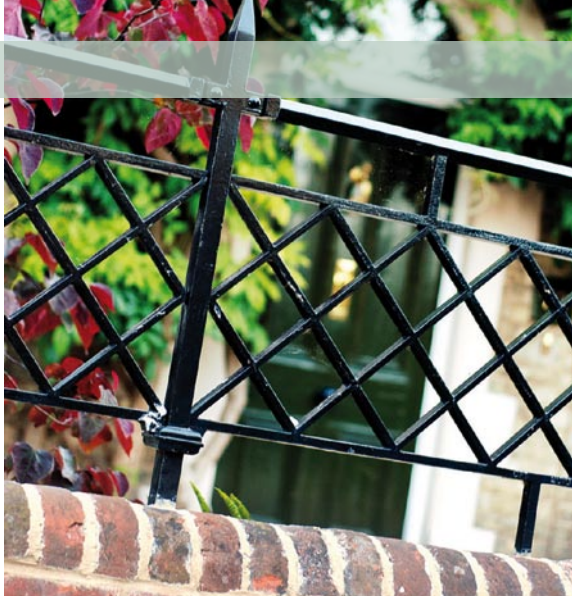
Today there is an increasing interest in reinstating these railings and boundary walls on street frontages, yet it is not always easy to know where to start.
